The Warrick County Commissioners met in regular session with Sarah Seaton, President and Stacey Franz, Vice President & Commissioner Terry Phillippe, Member. K.G.

Attorney Cliff Whitehead and Administrator Debbie Bennett-Stearsman were in attendance.

Auditor Michael Dietsch, Chief Deputy Barbi Shelton, and Recording Secretary Kristine Georges attended and recorded the minutes.

President Sarah Seaton called the meeting to order at 4:00 PM.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

AREA PLAN COMMISSION
REQUEST FOR EXTENSION OF SURETY
C-25-020 WARRICK COUNTY HUMANE SOCIETY

Area Plan Director Molly Barnhill presented a Request of Extension of Surety, C-25-020, Warrick County Humane Society, by Vicki Jenkins, Project Coordinator. Ms. Jenkins was present for the request. The County is holding \$15,049.88 in escrow for entrance construction. They have had one year. The letter of credit expires April 16, 2026. County Engineer Bobby Howard recommended approval. Commissioner Terry Phillippe made a motion to approve. Commissioner Stacey Franz seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

PEBBLE CREEK SUBDIVISION

The second request was for Pebble Creek Subdivision, Ruksam Development, LLC by Dr. Mohammed Hussain, Partner. The County is holding \$244,639.45 for street, sidewalk and drainage construction. They are requesting a one-year extension at a reduced dollar amount of \$193,027.45. They have had seven years. The letter of credit expires April 23, 2026. Project Engineer Jim Morley, Jr. was present. The County Engineer and County Surveyor signed off on the amounts and recommended approval. Commissioner Stacey Franz made a motion to approve. Commissioner Terry Phillippe seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

WILLOW ESTATES

The Last request was for Willow Estates, Thompson Homes, INC, by Thomas Thompson, President. The County is holding \$52,815.40 for streets, drainage, and sidewalk construction. They have had ten and a half years and are requesting a six-month extension. The previous six-month extension expires April 26, 2026. Project Engineer Jim Morley, Jr. was present. He said they won't be done by the April date, but they are working on it as we speak. Mr. Howard recommended approval. Commissioner Terry Phillippe made a motion to approve. Commissioner Stacey Franz seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

ITEMS FOR DISCUSSION
MAINSTREAM PERMITTING

County Administrator Debbie Bennett-Stearsman said the info was in Commissioners' packets. She reviewed the issues. They are asking for the County to forgive the permitting fees. Commissioner Phillippe said that Mr. Howard has been part of the discussion. He would be in favor in some of the fees from submissions prior to the passage of the Fees Ordinance. Ms. Bennett-Stearsman said there was another wave of approvals from the state last week. They then discussed when approvals were made as opposed to the fees put in place at the beginning of the year. There was also discussion on the fees and road rights-of-way. Mainstream is asking for more than \$175,000.00 in fees. Commissioner Phillippe made the motion that if the fiber operators grant applications were submitted before the fees were put into place they could be waived. Attorney Cliff Whitehead said he was uncomfortable with not setting a dollar amount. There was a discussion on these projects getting them into rural homes. There was continued discussion. They then discussed the Ordinance and when the fees actually took effect. Attorney Whitehead said he would also like to see a better timeline on when everything was established. Ms. Bennett-Stearsman discussed the timeline for submission of the applications. The motion died for lack of second. Commissioner Seaton and Commissioner Franz were uncomfortable with making any motions without knowing a timeline and getting their questions answered and the dollar impact. There were no other actions taken.

CENTERPOINT PERMITTING

Ms. Bennett-Stearsman was trying to get information on this and went over what she had. Mr. Howard said that he found some emails on it and what areas it covers and a payment was sent in and a permit was issued. He thinks that there were two permits for the same area. Commissioner Terry Phillippe made the motion to remove from the agenda until there's another ask. Commissioner Stacey Franz seconded. It carried 3-0.

**ACTION AGENDA
APPROVAL OF MINUTES
FEBRUARY 9, 2026**

Minutes for the February 9, 2026 Regular Session meeting were presented to the Commissioners for approval. Commissioner Stacey Franz made the motion to approve the minutes. Commissioner Terry Phillippe seconded the motion. The motion carried 2-0-1 with Sarah Seaton abstaining.

**APPROVAL OF ORDINANCE FOR FAILURE TO APPEAR FOR ASSESSOR
ORDINANCE 2026-02**

Assessor Sarah Redman present. She said this is for no-shows for their Property Tax Assessment Board of Appeals meetings. The PTABOA reviews appeals on assessments, so a lot of paperwork is done prior to the meetings making no-shows very frustrating. They have several no-shows at each meeting. Ms. Redman hopes this will help keep this from happening. It would be a charge of \$50.00 that they are allowed to make. Commissioner Terry Phillippe made a motion to approve Ordinance 2026-02. Commissioner Stacey Franz seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

APPROVAL OF STORM WATER RATE INCREASE

The Storm Water Rate Increase has been approved by the County Council and now is ready for approval by Commissioners. Commissioner Terry Phillippe made a motion to approve the increase. Commissioner Stacey Franz seconded the motion.

Brad Overton was present as a Warrick County resident and asked to speak. He would like them to reconsider. It is a 66% rate increase. All the projects are in Ohio Township. They could implement a Storm Water District to where the charge can be applied to the areas worked in instead of the County as a whole.

The Commissioners briefly reviewed the history. Commissioner Phillippe said he doesn't disagree with Mr. Overton's comments, but it has been approved all down the chain and they are just checking their box.

Mr. Overton also wanted to point out that other departments have to hold their budgets. Storm Water should have to do the same. Commissioner Seaton said that this is actually a public safety issue with the flooding and property damage they have seen more recently. She also said that it has been discussed for over a year now with studies done and seeing the need for the increase. Commissioner Terry Phillippe said that the new money will help Drainage Board as well. The Commissioners passed the motion 3-0 in favor of the increase.

AMENDMENT 2 – RQAW CONTRACT – SECURITY CENTER

Dave Rector with Project Partnership was present. He said this is an additional request that is above and beyond what was in the contract. It is for architectural and engineering involved with the relocation of a pole barn and gun range berm as well as a few other things. They are asking for \$25,000.00. Commissioner Terry Phillippe made a motion to approve. Commissioner Stacey Franz seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

SECURITY CENTER UPDATE

Mr. Rector also gave a brief update on the new Security Center. They are a little ahead of schedule and will be moving in soon. They are also on budget.

**DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS
ANIMAL CONTROL**

Animal Control Manager Brandon Russell was present. He talked about adopting out animals and working with their other partners. They also worked with staff on training through ASAPC. Animal Control is also now taking donations online.

BUILDING COMMISSION

Building Commissioner Jeff Daily was present. At the start of January of 2026, they had a balance of \$274,348.04 with 112 permits. They have taken in almost \$8,000.00 in collections. Those are all lower than the start of last year. However, in February they are already ahead of last year. He did have a handout for the Commissioners to review. Boonville now has their own inspector, but he doesn't feel it will impact the County much.

CORONER

Coroner Alissa Enright was present. She gave them a report for 2025. The County saw 972 deaths in 2025. They are tracking to be about the same in 2026. Overdose and suicide rates did not change. She reviewed community outreaches they have been involved with including collaborations with the Health Department. Ms. Enright said they have also been working with the Ohio Township Trustee on individuals that need to be buried coming from the hospitals. She also reviewed trainings for her staff and that she is currently on the State Board of Coroners representing the southern part of the state. There was also a brief discussion on opioid settlement funding.

COUNTY INSPECTOR

County Inspector Justin Landrum was present. He reviewed the large amount of unsettled nuisance reports he came into last fall when he started. They have been able to resolve most and now only eight are still active. He also reviewed some of the violations and letters of credit that have been done. He said for the most part everything is going well.

DRUG COURT

There was no one present from Drug Court.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT

Health Department Administrator April Hicks was present. Their new intern has started and they are very excited about that. She also went over some of their current partnerships, grants they are applying for, and community outreaches. They are still looking to fill two positions they have currently.

COMMUNITY CORRECTIONS

There was no one present from Community Corrections.

PURDUE EXTENSION

The plan on coming to the next time.

SHERIFF

The Sheriff was unable to come.

VETERAN'S OFFICE

Veteran's Officer Dwayne Beadles was present. There are 432 veterans/spouses they serve in Warrick County. They also help veterans in the surrounding counties. They will be closed several times this year for their training requirements. Commissioner Seaton asked for him to go over what their office does. Mr. Beadles talked about all benefits available for Veterans and working with them to get them. These however are different from the health benefits as that is a different division. Their office works directly for the Commissioners and the State. Mr. Beadles sends regular reports to the Commissioners for review.

Weights and Measures will be present at an upcoming meeting.

**COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR
AP VOUCHER**

The AP Voucher dated February 23, 2026 in the amount of \$4,314,498.75 was presented. Commissioner Terry Phillippe made a motion to approve. Commissioner Stacey Franz seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

AP VOUCHER UNCERTIFIED

The Uncertified AP Voucher dated February 23, 2026 in the amount of \$637.22. Of that, 607.77 is in credit card late fees. The rest are in fraudulent purchases. They will get back the money from the fraudulent charges. This is the fourth time the credit cards have been hacked. There was a brief discussion on the credit card late fees. They are not able to track down who caused the late fees. Commissioner Stacey Franz made a motion to pay the uncertified claims. Commissioner Terry Phillippe seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

Health Administrator April Hicks was present. She said they had already signed the grant as it was just a letter of intent. There was a brief discussion. The Grant amount is \$20,000.00 for Emergency Preparedness. Commissioner Stacey Franz approved the submittal. Commissioner Terry Phillippe seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

**CLARIFICATION OF ORDINANCE VS RESOLUTION
COMMISSIONERS MEETING DATES**

A clarification needed to be made for Ordinance 2025-21. Official Recording Secretary Kristine Georges said it was found through American Legal submissions. Ordinance 2025-21 had been presented as an Ordinance and assigned an Ordinance number but was titled Resolution 2025-21. The clarification just needed to be made that it was a Resolution. No further action was taken.

**ACQUISITIONS ADMINISTRATOR
RATIFY CONTRACTS
BUD'S PLUMBING**

Acquisitions Administrator Sherrie Sievers presented contracts for ratification. The first was for Bud's Plumbing for the Lynnville EMS Station in the amount of \$3,521.90 for a necessary repair that digging equipment, locating utilities, working on rotting sewer lines and installing new. A consensus was given by the Commissioners to proceed with the work. The contract needed to be ratified in a public meeting. Commissioner Stacey Franz made a motion to approve. Commissioner Terry Phillippe seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

**BNG – OLD COURTHOUSE
REPAIR GAS LINE LEAK**

Ms. Sievers said that a gas line leak needed to be repaired in the Old Courthouse. This was considered an emergency. Consensus was given by the Commissioners to proceed with BNG to make the repairs at a cost of \$396.00. The contract now needs to be ratified. Commissioner Stacey Franz made a motion to approve. Commissioner Terry Phillippe seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

**RADIANT PIPING REPAIR – VANN ROAD STORMWATER
HIGHWAY DEPT. BUILDING**

Ms. Sievers said she is working maintenance and Bobby Miller to address the Radiant Piping Repair at the Vann Road Storm Water Building. There is an issue with the main boiler linked to the radiant piping. She reviewed codes. She reached out to Altstadt as they put it in. Their cost is \$1,535.00. She also reached out to BNG. Their cost is \$1,165.00. Altstadt required more, but included heat sensor they said needed to be replaced. She reviewed briefly continued maintenance that will be addressed at a future meeting. There are no warranties in place. Commissioner Terry Phillippe made a motion to approve the work through BNG and ask them to also look at the heat sensor. Commissioner Stacey Franz seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

County Engineer Bobby Howard presented Change Order 1 for Telephone Road. It’s for an additional \$24,480.00 for excavation. This has been reviewed and is ready for approval. Commissioner Terry Phillippe made a motion to approve. Commissioner Stacey Franz seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

CHANGE ORDER 2 TELEPHONE ROAD

Next, he presented Change Order 2 for Telephone Road. This is also for some excavation on some cross-sections in the amount of \$14,730.00 Commissioner Stacey Franz made a motion to approve. Commissioner Terry Phillippe seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

DECLARATION OF WEAPON SURPLUS**

Sergeant Kyle Tevault was present for the Sheriff’s Office. Lieutenant Brian Waters is retiring after thirty-two years of service. They are asking for his service weapon to be declared surplus. This is done for officers with over ten years of service that they keep their service weapon. Commissioner Terry Phillippe made the motion to declare surplus. Commissioners Stacey Franz seconded the motion. The motion carried 3-0.

**ATTORNEY
METZGER CONSTRUCTION – BITUMINOUS RESURFACING PROJECT 2026-01**

Mr. Andrew Effinger, attorney for E & B Paving, was present. E & B Paving was awarded the Bituminous Resurfacing Project pending review at the last Commissioners’ meeting. They received notice that they were not responsive. E & B Paving then sent a letter to the County Attorney and then to the Commissioners. Mr. Effinger went over the awarding of the bid and the reasons for the forms and whether it was material that one of the forms was not present. No one is contesting that they are responsible or destroying the competitive nature. They did not do either of these. They suggested that the County accept E & B Paving and save the money in court costs and award as they did in the last meeting. E & B appreciates the opportunity to work with Warrick County.

Mr. Howard then spoke. He said that the bid packet required those forms and therefore it was considered unresponsive. They have never varied from this.

Attorney Whitehead said that action needed to be taken. The Commissioners needed to reject E & B Paving as unresponsive with the two missing forms and award to Metzger. Commissioner Terry Phillippe made the motion to do so. Commissioner Stacey Franz seconded the motion. The motion carried 2-0-1 with Sarah Seaton abstaining.

Manufacturing is down to 10%. He is not trying to be annoying. But, he wants it to be at the forefront. Commissioner Phillippe said he understands where Mr. Heath is coming from, and is just as concerned as he is as well as the other two Commissioners. Commissioner Seaton said it would take a lot to show a positive impact right now.

FIRE ORDINANCE DISCUSSION

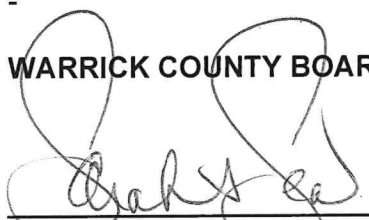
