The Warrick County Council met in regular session using online Zoom conference session in Warrick County, Indiana.
Attorney Cliff Whitehead and Administrator Krystal Powless was in attendance.
Auditor Debbie Stevens and Secretary Kristine Georges attended and recorded the minutes.

Council President, Greg Richmond, called the meeting to order at 6:00 PM.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Greg Richmond: We'll go ahead and do Roll Call.

Krystal Powless: Charlie Christmas?

Charlie Christmas: Present.

Krystal Powless: David Hachmeister?

David Hachmeister: Here.

Krystal Powless: Cindy Ledbetter?

Cindy Ledbetter: Present.

Krystal Powless: Ted Metzger?

Ted Metzger: Present.

Krystal Powless: Brad Overton?

Brad Overton: Here.

Krystal Powless: Richard Reid?

Richard Reid: Present.

Krystal Powless: Greg Richmond?

Greg Richmond: Here.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES
MARCH 5, 2020 and MARCH 26, 2020

Councilman Richmond: New business, the minutes, I read both of them and I did send some directions on the inaudibles and Kristine got that corrected from the meeting that we had on March 26th. And then I read the March 5th minutes. I didn't find any errors in that. Did anybody find any corrections? If not, I'll take a motion.

Councilwoman Ledbetter: Motion to approve the minutes.

Councilman Richmond: Motion by Cindy. Is there a second?

Councilman Reid: Second.

Councilman Metzger: Second.

Councilman Overton: Second.

Councilman Richmond: Take my pick. Rick.

Councilman Reid: Okay.

Councilman Richmond: And all those in favor? If there's somebody that is not in favor of this, let me know, and otherwise I'll say everybody is 'aye'. Sounds like it's seven, zero (7-0) on that one (1).

CUMULATIVE DRAIN BUSINESS
MOTORIZED EQUIPMENT

Councilman Richmond: Next order of business, Additional Appropriation under Cum Drain, the Surveyor is asking for an Additional Appropriation in Surveyor Section Corner for Motorized Equipment of eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000.00). We discussed this at the last meeting and asked them to move it to Section Corner.

Councilman Hachmeister: Well, I'll just lead off the discussion then. I spoke with Jason over it. And I did not know they already had one (1) ATV and the four (4) wheeler, which right now they have a UTV and an ATV. And the only

reason he really wanted another one (1) is so he didn't have to take the sprayer in and out of the other one (1). And that's what he told me himself. I wasn't aware he said they had the other one (1) that's about eight (8) years.

Councilman Overton: And how many people is in that Department? Isn't it four (4)?

Councilman Hachmeister: I think there's just four (4), is that right? The Surveyor, Deputy, Rodman, and Clerk?

Krystal Powless: Correct.

Councilman Hachmeister: And the...

Councilman Overton: The Clerk, the Clerk wouldn't be going out into the field, so basically we get this other vehicle, would give every person in the Surveyor's Office a vehicle? Or an ATV or a UTV?

Councilman Hachmeister: Well, that's, and a truck for everybody.

Councilman Overton: Yeah, that's...

Councilman Hachmeister: I mean that's just what, like I say, what Jason told me yesterday.

Councilman Metzger: David, my notes says that one (1) ATV is in disrepair. Is that gonna, is this gonna replace that one (1)?

Councilman Hachmeister: No, they're still using it.

Councilman Metzger: Okay.

Councilman Hachmeister: Okay, I'll just tell you exactly, almost word for word what Jason said. They'd like to keep the ATV for riding in the woods and keep the sprayer on the one (1) UTV and use the other and use the new ATV for riding back and forth if they do have to check on a job.

Councilman Metzger: Well, that changes things.

Councilman Hachmeister: Well, exactly with, after I spoke with him cause I was all in favor of, hey, if he could make use of it sometime. They've got the money in Section Corner to do it. But all this information, I, you know, I just throw my opinion out there. You can do what you want. But I, but why they need three (3) off-road vehicles?

Councilman Metzger: Like I said, I thought they were going to replace the one (1) in disrepair with this one (1). But since that's not the case, then that kind of changes my opinion.

Councilman Hachmeister: Well, when my original question was asked, I asked him what he was going to do with it. Of course, he tried telling me it wasn't worth any money, they'd just keep it and use it in the woods. So.

Councilman Overton: Seems to me like he'd be able to get, I mean, you could get rid of maybe two (2) of those vehicles and keep just one (1). I don't know. The numbers of vehicles corresponding with the employees in that department seem to be, the ratio seems to be pretty high. As well as vehicles.

Councilman Metzger: Okay, I'm through discussing it.

Councilman Overton: I mean I'd probably be inclined to consider this if they would be interested in, you know, selling two (2) of those vehicles. But, I mean to think that there's three (3) vehicles for each person in there that actually go in the field. Seems to be a little bit excessive at this point in time.

Councilman Hachmeister: I...

Councilman Richmond: Want to table it and give everybody a chance to talk to them and make sure that, you know, they find out, they're going to have three (3) vehicles that are in use. I mean if one's in disrepair bad enough that it needs to go, they need to get rid of it.

Councilman Hachmeister: I will tell you that Jason said, you know, that it's not really, trying to think how he said, a necessary item right now, and he said like, you know, they're shut down if they don't have it. But, you know, like I was thinking last month, the money's there in Section Corner, and they can make use of it, fine. But after the information I got from him, that they've already got two (2), I told him I didn't understand why they really want to have it. Cause if they're going to use one (1) at a time and two (2) will be sitting.

Councilman Reid: That sounds very excessive.

Councilman Hachmeister: So. I'm just looking at they'd be able to use that money for something later on even though it is Section Corner money that we're looking at now.

Councilman Richmond: Well, I need a motion to either deny, table, or allow.

Councilman Overton: I'm going to make a motion to table to see if they'd be willing to part or to sell two (2) of those vehicles and can give us more information on that.

Councilman Richmond: Okay, motion by Brad to table. Is there a second?

Councilman Metzger: I'll second that.

Councilman Christmas: I'll second that motion.

Councilman Richmond: Ted's seconding it then. And is there any further discussion on the issue? And then I'll also ask for each, when we're going through each item, is there any public comment. I see one's in the chat. Cliff, if there's not any response, then I can take the votes.

Cliff Whitehead: Yes.

Councilman Richmond: Okay, all those in favor of tabling the Surveyor Section Corner's request for eleven thousand dollars (\$11,000.00). Roll Call?

Krystal Powless: Charlie Christmas?

Councilman Christmas: I, I agree with the motion.

Krystal Powless: David?

Councilman Hachmeister: Aye.

Krystal Powless: Cindy?

Councilwoman Ledbetter: Aye.

Krystal Powless: Ted?

Councilman Metzger: Aye.

Krystal Powless: Brad?

Councilman Overton: Aye.

Krystal Powless: Richard?

Councilman Reid: Aye.

Krystal Powless: Greg?

Councilman Richmond: Aye. So that's seven, zero (7-0). Thank you.

Councilman Hachmeister: I will add, I will add one (1) thing about the Section Corner I found out. I found out the Surveyor's Office is contracting Benardin Lochmueller to do all the Section Corners.

Councilman Overton: So, if someone's being contracted to do the Section Corner work, that really kind of questions, well, anyway, that's for a different day I guess.

Councilman Richmond: This is primarily going to be used for ditches. They are just using the Section Corner money because it's available and it's not tax money.

Councilman Overton: Right.

AREA PLAN BUSINESS EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR RETIREMENT

Councilman Richmond: Are we ready for Area Plan?

Councilman Metzger: (Inaudible) go.

Councilman Richmond: Area Plan Appropriation request. This is per the Handbook. The Area Plan Commission Executive Director, eleven thousand four hundred ninety-five dollars (\$11,495.00), Additional Appropriation. And then the Salary Ordinance for the retiree, which is the Director, Executive Director, eleven thousand four hundred ninety-four dollars and twenty-three cents (\$11,494.23).

Councilman Overton: I'd like to make a motion. But before, before we go on with that, I'd also like to congratulate Sherri on her retirement. And I appreciate the service she's put over here for the Additional Appropriation and the Salary Ordinance.

Councilman Richmond: I have a motion by Brad to do 3A and 3B, the Additional Appropriation and Salary Ordinance. Is there a second?

Councilman Hachmeister: Second by David.

Councilman Richmond: David, second, David. And now, I'll ask if there's any further discussion? Any comment from the public?

Cliff Whitehead: No.

Councilman Richmond: Okay, all those in, well let's, I could do this simply by asking if there's anybody apposing? Speak up now. So, I think this is again one (1) of those seven, o. (7-0). If not, I'll say seven (7) agree, yes. And zero (0) nays. Is that okay with everybody?

Several consents: (Inaudible).

Councilman Richmond: Okay.

VETERAN AFFAIRS BUSINESS ASSISTANT SERVICE OFFICER

Councilman Richmond: Next up is the same issue with the Handbook, Veteran's Affairs Business, Additional Appropriation, Assistant Service Officer, three thousand five hundred dollars (\$3,500.00) and then the Salary Ordinance, the Assistant VSO Retiree, eight thousand one hundred sixty dollars and fifty-two cents (\$8,160.52).

Councilman Overton: I'll also make a motion for 4A and 4B, and I'd also like to congratulate Jenny on her retirement.

Councilman Richmond: Have a motion by Brad to do 4A and 4B, the Additional Appropriation of thirty-five hundred (\$3,500.00) and the Salary Ordinance of eighty-one-sixty dot fifty-two (\$8,160.52).

Councilman Christmas: I will second that motion.

Councilman Richmond: Charlie Christmas seconds. Thank you.

Councilman Overton: I did want to ask a question through. Krystal, what the, the eighty-one-sixty (\$8,160.00), what's the difference there with the thirty-five hundred (\$3,500.00)?

Krystal Powless: He intends to hire someone who doesn't have longevity, so they don't need the full amount in that line item once that person comes in. So, they only needed thirty-five hundred (\$3,500.00).

Councilman Overton: Okay, just wanted to make sure. I remember that now. Thanks.

Councilman Richmond: Okay, I have a motion by Brad and second by Charlie. Should I do a roll call or is there somebody that would like to say, nay? If there are no, nays, double negative there. Then I will assume everybody is an aye. So that will be a vote of seven, zero (7-0). If there's no objection, that's what we'll call it.

Councilman Metzger: Good.

Councilman Richmond: Seven, zero (7-0) then. I forgot to ask for public comment on that. (Inaudible), Cliff, I'm sorry. I assume there's no public comment.

Cliff Whitehead: There is none.

Councilman Richmond: Okay.

PROSECUTOR BUSINESS WITNESS FEE

Councilman Richmond: The Prosecutor Business is next. He had requested originally ten thousand dollars (\$10,000.00). In speaking with him, basically, since we are kind of shut down right now, he said five thousand (\$5,000.00) would be enough. So you can change the ten thousand (\$10,000.00) request to five thousand (\$5,000.00).

Councilman Hachmeister: David...I make a motion for the five thousand (\$5,000.00).

Councilman Richmond: Motion by David.

Councilman Overton: Second.

Councilman Richmond: Witness Fees for five thousand dollar (\$5,000.00) Additional Appropriation for the Prosecutor. Is there a second?

Councilman Overton: Second.

Councilman Richmond: Second by Brad. If I hear the wrong person, let me know. Okay, and any discussion on that? Any public comment?

Cliff Whitehead: No.

Councilman Richmond: Okay. If there's no objection, then if you have a nay, let me know now. And seeing no objection, it's a lot easier this way. I hope it's all legal and okay. Seven (7), ayes and zero (0) nays. (7-0) Okay.

HEALTH DEPARTMENT BUSINESS ANIMAL CONTROL – VAXCARE

Councilman Richmond: The next one (1) is Health Department Business, Additional Appropriation, Animal Control, five thousand two hundred ten (\$5,210.00) and Vaxcare, one thousand five hundred nineteen (\$1,519.00); for a total of six thousand seven hundred and twenty-nine dollars (\$6,729.00). And this is the reimbursement that we always pass through.

Councilman Overton: Motion to approve.

Councilman Richmond: Motion by Brad. Is there a second?

Councilwoman Ledbetter: I'll second.

Councilman Richmond: Second by Cindy. Any discussion? Any public comment?

Cliff Whitehead: No.

Councilman Richmond: Okay. I think this one (1) would probably be a seven, 'o (7-0) since it's a reimbursement. So, I'll ask, is there any objection to seven (7) ayes and zero (0) nays? Then we'll count that as a vote of seven (7) ayes and zero (0) nays. (Motion carried 7-0).

ASSESSOR BUSINESS **CONTRACTUAL SERVICES – REASSESSMENT**

Councilman Richmond: Next up is Assessor Business, Additional Appropriation out of the Reassessment Fund, Contractual Services, ninety-one thousand dollars (\$91,000.00). And they have plenty of money in that fund to fund this. We'll do these each 7A and 7B differently. Anybody want to discuss or is there a motion?

Councilman Metzger: I'll make a motion for 7A.

Councilman Reid: Second by Rick.

Councilman Richmond: Motion by Ted. Second by Rick to approve the ninety-one thousand (\$91,000.00) Additional Appropriation, Contractual Services out of Reassessment. Any further discussion? Any public comment?

Cliff Whitehead: No.

Councilman Richmond: Okay. Then I will ask the question, is there any nays or objections to this? If not, I'll assume it's like acclamation seven (7) ayes and zero (0) nays is the vote. (Motion carried 7-0)

SALARY ORDINANCE **BOARD MEMBER PER DIEM**

Councilman Richmond: The Salary Ordinance is next. Now this was a mistake that was caught by, I guess the State Auditors or our Auditor. It's a Board Member Per Diem in Reassessment of seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) for PTBOA Board and the Salary Ordinance that we have says fifty dollars (\$50.00). But, we were paying seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) which is what we budgeted. So, that's what's in the budget. Open for discussion or motion.

Councilman Reid: Motion to approve by Rick.

Councilman Richmond: Motion by Rick to approve seventy-five dollars (\$75.00) Board Member Per Diem. Is there a second?

Councilman Hachmeister: Second by David.

Councilman Richmond: Second by David. Thank you. That's a good way of doing it. And now, is there any discussion?

Councilman Overton: I wonder on these per diems if we shouldn't in the fall look at making sure these are consistent all across the board. Because, if I'm not mistaken, the Area Plan Commission per diem was fifty dollars (\$50.00) as well.

Councilman Richmond: Yeah, and the Parks Board may be that too.

Councilman Overton: Yeah, so I don't know. I don't know if this has been fifty (\$50.00) in the past or not. I didn't look at that. But, might be something so we can stay consistent across the board.

Councilman Reid: If you ask me, might be a lot longer too.

Councilman Overton: Yeah.

Councilman Richmond: Krystal, can you check on that for us?

Krystal Powless: I've already looked into it.

Councilman Richmond: Okay. And is there any public comment?

Cliff Whitehead: No.

Councilman Richmond: Okay. Seeing no public comment or further discussion, I'll call for a vote for the same way. If there are any nay votes, any objections, any nay votes? So, I assume all seven (7) of us are in favor of the vote with seven (7) ayes and zero (0) nays.

ELECTION BUSINESS **CONTRACTUAL SERVICES**

Councilman Richmond: Next is Election Business, Contractual Services of fifteen thousand dollars (\$15,000.00).

Councilman Hachmeister: Well, they're required to send out the cards for it. So, I make a motion to approve. David.

Councilman Overton: And I'll second.

Councilman Richmond: Motion by David to approve. Is that Brad seconding?

Councilman Overton: It is.

Councilman Richmond: Okay. Is there any discussion on this?

Councilman Overton: I just also wonder if we're not going to have to end up having to allocate some additional funding for this in the upcoming month as well. So, just something for us all, which I'm sure we've all thought about it.

Councilman Richmond: Yeah, I'm wondering the same thing. I wonder if there's going to be more mail-ins and that's going to cost a lot more. I know poor Wisconsin, they were up there having votes in the middle of all this and it's not a good situation when we're trying to mitigate like were doing. Okay, is there any further discussion on the Election Business, Election Board Contractual Services? Any public comment?

Cliff Whitehead: No.

Councilman Richmond: Okay, seeing none then I'll ask the same thing, are there any objections or nay votes? Seeing none, I'll assume that's seven (7) ayes and zero (0) nays. (Motion carried 7-0).

HIGHWAY BUSINESS LIABILITY INSURANCE – WORKMEN'S COMP

Councilman Richmond: Next up is Additional Appropriations, Highway Business. They have Liability Insurance of three thousand six hundred eighty-nine dollars (\$3,689.00) and Workmen's Comp of seventeen thousand four hundred ninety-two dollars (\$17,492.00) for a total of twenty-one thousand one hundred eighty-one dollars (\$21,181.00).

Councilman Hachmeister: Motion to approve by David.

Councilman Overton: Second.

Councilman Richmond: Motion by David. Second by Brad, was it?

Councilman Overton: Correct.

Councilman Richmond: Okay. Discussion? Public comment?

Cliff Whitehead: None.

Councilman Richmond: Okay, seeing none, I'll ask, are there any nays or objections? Seeing none, I'll assume that is seven (7) ayes and zero (0) nays for the vote on that one (1) to approve. (Motion carried 7-0).

SUPERIOR COURT EQUIPMENT - LAPTOPS

Councilman Richmond: Next up is Item 10, Superior Court, Adult Probation, Superior Court, a fifteen thousand dollar (\$15,000.00) request. And this is a fee fund. It's not tax money. This is so they can work from home. They have to have secure laptops or tablets.

Councilwoman Ledbetter: Motion to approve by Cindy.

Councilman Richmond: Motion by Cindy to approve. Is there a second?

Councilman Overton: Second.

Councilman Richmond: Second by Brad. Discussion?

Councilman Reid: Does that mean the other Departments are going to ask for this too?

Krystal Powless: I, I really can't answer that. I can tell you that no one (1) else has. And a lot of people are already working from home.

Councilman Metzger: Sure.

Krystal Powless: So, I would think that we would have already seen it if we were going to. Not saying it won't happen, but...

Councilman Reid: Well, what's going to happen to those laptops when everyone gets back to work?

Krystal Powless: You know I can't answer that.

Councilman Reid: I know that.

Councilman Richmond: Hopefully, they'll stay in Superior Court or they'll be shared with other Courts.

Councilman Christmas: My internet unstable.

Councilman Richmond: Any further discussion?

Councilman Overton: Did Charlie say something? I couldn't make out what he said.

Councilman Richmond: Charlie?

Councilman Christmas: My internet was giving me fits.

Councilman Richmond: Okay. Are you okay, now?

Councilman Christmas: I'm okay now.

Councilman Richmond: Alright. So, we're ready for the vote. And I didn't ask, I didn't ask for public comment I don't think. Public comment?

Councilman Reid: Did we get a second on that too?

Councilman Richmond: Yes, Brad did.

Cliff Whitehead: No request for public comment.

Councilman Richmond: Okay, no request for public comment. Then I'll call for the vote. First of all, are there any nays or objection?

Councilman Metzger: Nay, Ted.

Councilman Richmond: Okay.

Councilman Reid: Nay, Rick.

Councilman Richmond: So, Ted and Rick are nays. That's two (2). Anybody else nay? And then the ayes would be five (5); Ted and Rick are the nays. That is approved five to two (5-2 with Ted Metzger and Rick Reid opposing).

COUNCIL BUSINESS BUDGET MEETING DATES

Councilman Richmond: In Council Business, our Budget Meeting Dates, I don't have any conflicts. Anybody have conflicts? That's our long day. (Inaudible) days, two (2) of them, Public Hearings.

Krystal Powless: I do want you guys to be thinking, I mean, I don't know how long this is going to last. So, be thinking about, you know, brainstorming, what we're going to do if, if this draws out for a long period of time. You know, I don't know whether that would be, you know, we have to hold everything virtually or we just say we're gonna freeze everything for next year and look at raises and not meet with office holders. I just want you all to be thinking about it just in case.

Councilman Reid: We could just spread out farther in there.

Councilman Richmond: Sit out in the audience I guess. But, hopefully, this will be not as bad by then. But...

Krystal Powless: I hope not. I'm just, you know, just...yeah.

Councilman Richmond: The plan. Yeah.

Councilman Hachmeister: Krystal? What would be the latest date that we can possibly get started?

Krystal Powless: Well, here's the thing, too. I'm a little concerned about the Job Study.

Councilman Richmond: Yeah.

Krystal Powless: Cause now they've reduced their staff and I don't think we're going to get it as timely. And I don't know if it will be ready for next year's budget. That concerns me. And then as far as, I have the last date is October 22nd. So, we can hold some of those initial meetings later, but we still need to adopt at that time.

Councilman Hachmeister: Okay.

Krystal Powless: Okay? I just wouldn't be able to get the numbers to you as quickly if we don't start in July.

Councilman Hachmeister: That's what I was looking at, delaying a month.

Councilman Richmond: We should all be looking at the numbers, I think, anyway, no matter what. And yeah, if we have to...

Krystal Powless: No, yeah, I meant like, I didn't mean that. I will have numbers for you, but once you guys make your decision, I will have a limited amount of time to get the information prepared for you. But, I will make it work, you know that. So.

Councilman Hachmeister: Okay, you know we're still, you know, four (4) months, five (5) months down the road.

Councilman Richmond: Yeah, I hope and pray it will get better.

Krystal Powless: Yeah, I know.

APPROPRIATION FOR MASKS - DISCUSSION

Councilwoman Ledbetter: I have a question. Do we need to vote on the Appropriations for the masks? Do we need to do that this evening or (inaudible) return?

Krystal Powless: Cliff, do you want to take that one (1)?

Cliff Whitehead: We're going to do it at the May meeting because the decision was made that there was not enough time to advertise for the Additional Appropriation for a regular meeting. So, we'll advertise it for and discuss it at the May meeting.

Councilwoman Ledbetter: Thank you. And I just want to say thank you, Greg, for realizing the importance of having us all make decisions during this time. I really appreciate it.

Councilman Richmond: You're welcome. We owe a great deal to a couple of public people who are going over to get these, using a private jet to go get them and not charging us for the jet. So, but they're bringing them back for a lot of people in the area. And yeah, I'm really glad the opportunity came up. It's not finished yet. There's still some little glitches here and there. The Federal Government kind of wants to tap on a little, what would you call it, a tax or a tariff on the masks. And I also heard there's a possibility that the Federal Government may want to move it into their own supply rather than let us have it. So they are working, the Commissioners are working with the private people to get this done. And yeah, it's desperately needed now. We're up to thirty (30) today. I know that ten (10) of them are in one (1) place. So, it's really scary.

Councilman Metzger: But, on the other hand, fifteen (15) have recovered and they've gone on with their normal life.

Councilman Richmond: Yeah, that's good. I would not be one (1) of those, two (2) of those underlying conditions. Yeah, so, we've got to think about everybody.

Councilman Overton: Yeah, I'd also like to echo Cindy's comments and thank Greg for moving quickly on that. And I was a little disappointed to listen to some of the background information on how some of those purchases were actually almost put on hold and they almost tried to be frozen. Someone was trying to not allow Greg to go ahead and make that appropriation as we agreed to. I found that to be quite disturbing. But, you know, that's for another discussion.

Councilman Richmond: These are unique times and, so everybody is okay with today.

Councilman Christmas: (Inaudible) who that was.

Councilman Richmond: And before I adjourn I will also some public comments, but I have one (1) comment. To let you all know that every day, you all are in my prayers. Pray for protection from this terrible, terrible disease. Are there any public comments that the public would like to speak before we do get to the point of adjournment?

Krystal Powless: I would like to say one (1) thing. I got a text from Sherri and she just wanted to thank you for your kind words and for approving her payout.

BUDGET MEETING DATES – CONTINUED DISCUSSION

Councilman Reid: Hey, Greg, did you make a motion and a second on that budget meeting dates?

Councilman Richmond: No, we didn't make a motion and second. I think, Krystal, do we want a motion on that? Or we just asking everybody if it's okay?

Krystal Powless: Cliff, what do you think?

Cliff Whitehead: We don't need a motion.

Councilman Hachmeister: It's subject to change, isn't it?

Krystal Powless: Well, yeah. I hope not. But, it could.

Councilman Hachmeister: Well, I want to thank Krystal and Cliff and Greg for all the extra time you all put in to this to put it together. I mean it's a shame we have to do this but appreciate your time you all put in for it.

Councilman Reid: Yeah, great job.

Councilman Overton: Very much so.

Councilman Metzger: Yep, thank you.

Councilman Richmond: He sure has. I've been on the phone and Krystal's been on the phone with him.






